Why do we have one?

Campus Advisory Councils (CACs) are designed to ensure that teachers, parents and community members have an active voice in what happens at their local schools and provide valuable input to principals, who ultimately have the decision-making responsibility for their campuses.

How do you get to be on it?

Parents, community and business members submit an application in the spring for open seats on the council. Members are selected over the summer, but visitors are always welcome at our meetings.

When does it meet?

The CAC meets 8 times during the school year. Typically, it is on the first Monday of the month at 3:15 pm in the library. Check Kiker's website for meeting dates.

What does CAC discuss?

You can find our agenda with our topics up for discussion and the minutes of what was discussed on Kiker's website. You can also find hardcopies of the agenda and minutes at the front office. The agenda is posted on the bulletin board at least 72 hours before the meetings.

Can I come?

Of course! Meetings are open to the public. Also, there is a time set aside at the beginning of each meeting for people to speak on any issue that relates to Kiker that they would like the CAC to consider.
